Student Affairs

1. Financial Support

- A. Entrance Fee Support: 1,195,000 KRW for 1st semester
- **B. Tuition Supports**: 6,754,000 KRW per coursework semester, 810,500 KRW per thesis semester
- C. Dorm Supports: 1,500,000 per semester (directly pay to the dorm)
 - * up to **four** semesters (Th.D.) / up to **three** semesters (Th.M.) support available
- D. Living Stipend: 1,440,000 KRW per semester (240,000 KRW * 6 months)
 - * up to four semesters (Th.D.) / up to three semesters (Th.M.) support available
 - * directly delivered to your bank account indicated in the Portal
 - * applicable ONLY during the time when students reside in Korea
 - * Students should spend most of time in Korea during summer/winter break in order to receive the stipend for those two months of vacation.

2. School Regulations

A. Leave of Absence

- 1) If you have to take a leave of absence due to some reasons, please let GIT administrator know in advance. If so, all scholarship should be returned and kept until you return to school (in case of general leave of absence).
- 2) If you are taking an illness leave during a semester, medical report from a hospital (질병휴학을 위한 병원의료 진료서) should be submitted to GIT Office (medical leave of absence will be effective from the next semester).
- 3) Students who are in leave of absence must let GIT office know and leave the country <u>within 15 days after applying</u>. Students also should return their alien registration card to the immigration at the airport.
- 4) When returning from leave of absence, students should apply online at Yonsei Portal and contact GIT office in order to obtain a new student visa.

B. Health Insurance

- 1) Health insurance for international students is mandatory in Korea even if the medical insurance of your home country is valid.
- 2) Please refer to GIT Homepage > [Student Life] > [Health and Counselling].

C. Living Allowance

- 1) Payments will be made to a student account at the end of each month.
- 2) The stipend is applicable only during the time when students reside in Korea.

D. Dormitory

- 1) Deposit of 100,000 KRW is required every semester before moving in.
- 2) Paying cash is not applicable. Students can find where to transfer the deposit at the Portal as follows: http://portal.yonsei.ac.kr > Academic Information System > Academic Management System > School Life > Songdo Dormitory > Bill (Printout).
- 3) The deposit will be automatically refunded around the first month of next semester to the account which has been registered, please make sure to register the right bank account number.
- 4) How to check/modify the bank account number
 - a) http://portal.yonsei.ac.kr > Academic Information System > Academic Management System > Student Record > Information > Personal Data > Bank Account (Modify)
 - b) Domestic bank account with student's own name is only available to register.
- 5) Please note that students must apply for the dormitory housing through Yonsei Portal. The dormitory administrative team will announce the application period when ready. If you are planning to stay outside the campus, GIT office should be informed in advance.
- 6) All students can apply for double rooms only. Students cannot choose a roommate (random assignment).
- 7) A copy of chest X-ray and vaccination certificates should be submitted when you move in. (All students should prepare above mentioned documents by themselves.)

E. Submission of Medical Certificates

- 1) All students who are willing to move into the dormitory must submit 'Chest X-ray results (for tuberculosis test)' and 'Certificate of MMR (Measles, Mumps & Rubella) Vaccination' (only Korean and English versions are valid).
 - * 기숙사 제출서류: 흉부 X선 진단서(결핵), MMR(홍역, 볼거리, 풍진) 예방접종 증명서
- 2) X-ray for tuberculosis (TB) inspection
 - a) TB inspection should be done in the hospital and must not go over expire date (within 2 month from a date of issue).
 - b) TB inspection certificate must be submitted every semester.
 - c) Once issued, the X-ray Certificate is valid within 2 months from the Move-in date.
 - d) CD, film etc. cannot be submitted instead of the certificate. Only the document of certificate with the seal can be submitted.
 - e) Where to take TB test
 - Any hospitals for internal diseases (내과) or
 - Public health center (보건소) or
 - Korean Radiology Clinic (대한영상의학과) Sinchon Subway Station (Exit 6)
- 3) MMR vaccination certificate
 - a) Where to take: any hospitals for internal diseases (내과)
 - b) Those who have already submitted the MMR certificate do not need to submit it again.
- 4) Move-in is only available if both documents are submitted at the time of checking

- in. If one of those document is not prepared, move-in is basically not allowed on that day of arriving. Move-in procedure might be refused if it turns out that communal living is not possible according to the results of the medical check up.
- 5) Where to submit: the dormitory reception in the lobby on the very day of move-in
- 6) Inquiries: 032-749-5103 (Dormitory 1), 032-749-5203 (Dormitory 2)

F. When You Visit Your Home Country

- 1) Students must notify GIT office of their flight schedule in advance no matter what they go overseas for research or personal reasons.
- 2) Please note that once students leave Korea in the middle of semester, the D-2 visa might be very hard to reissue depending on their home country immigration law. Re-entry may not be guaranteed even though students already possess an alien registration card. In that case, <u>GIT highly recommend students to stay in Korea before they graduate</u>.
- 3) Students should enter Korea at least three days before a semester begins. If students cannot enter in time due to unexpected problems regarding the visa, GIT office must be informed via email.

- 2) Using certificate machine
 - a) Songdo campus: 1st floor of Vision Hall (종합관)
 - b) Sinchon campus: at Backyangnoori (백양누리) near the shuttle bus stop
- 3) <u>Certificate of residence</u>: http://portal.yonsei.ac.kr > Academic Information System > Academic Management System > School Life > Certificate of Residence > Browse (Or visit dormitory administration office to issue in person)
- 4) If you want any other forms or letters asked by your home institution or churches, please contact GIT director in advance.

3. International Affairs - Visa & Sojourn

A. Visa Matters

- 1) <u>All international student MUST hold D-2 visa (student visa)</u> to maintain student status. If some of students has other visa type, they must apply for changing visa type by visiting the immigration office within 1 month from their entry date.
- 2) Please note that this is students' responsibility to take all matters related to international affairs such as visas and alien registration card. Students should ask GIT office for help to issue the official documents to submit to the immigration office and secure their visa status. GIT office cannot do any of visa/ARC

application on behalf of students.

B. Alien Registration Card

- 1) All non-Korean nationals who are newly enrolled at Yonsei must apply for Alien registration card within 90 days from the entry date.
- 2) Students should make a reservation to visit the immigration office at https://www.hikorea.go.kr/.
- 2) Required documents:
 - a) Application form (download at https://www.hikorea.go.kr/ or visit GIT office)
 - b) Passport
 - c) 1 passport photo
 - d) Application fee: 30,000 KRW
 - e) Certificate of residence
 - f) Certificate of enrollment
 - e) Certificate of Scholarship of Tuition
 - f) Please note that students might be asked for additional certificates regarding some medical diagnosis from the immigration office if necessary.
- 3) Please always make sure to secure the sojourn period. Students who want to keep their studying in GIT and extend the sojourn period should visit the immigration office in advance.

C. Part-time Job

- 1) Students holding D-2 visa can have part-time job outside campus which must be reported to the immigration office (https://www.hikorea.go.kr/).
- 2) Required documents: the application form, passport, alien registration card and part-time work of foreign student confirmation form.
- 3) Students in leave of absence are not able to have part-time job.
